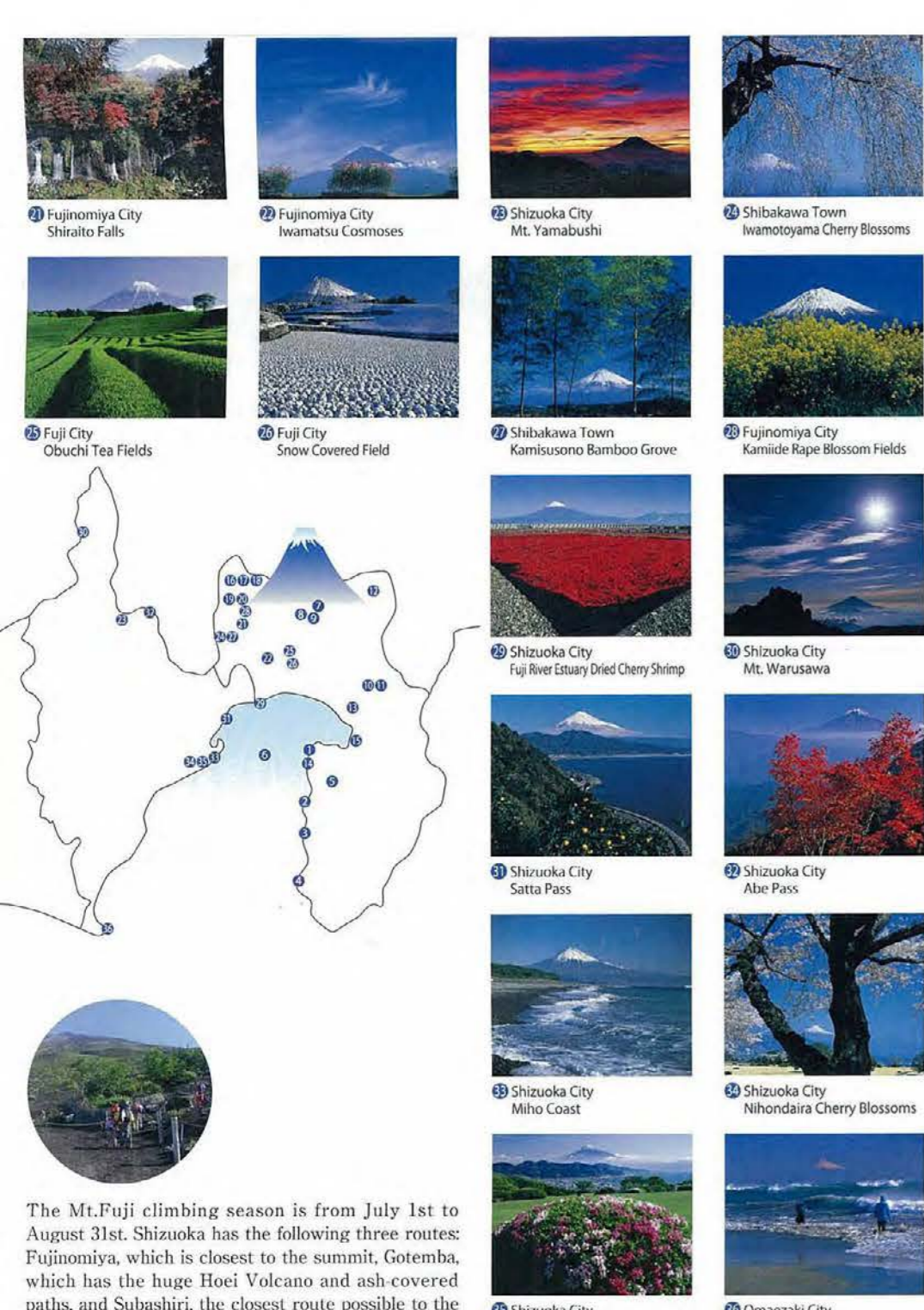


# Shizuoka Guide Map

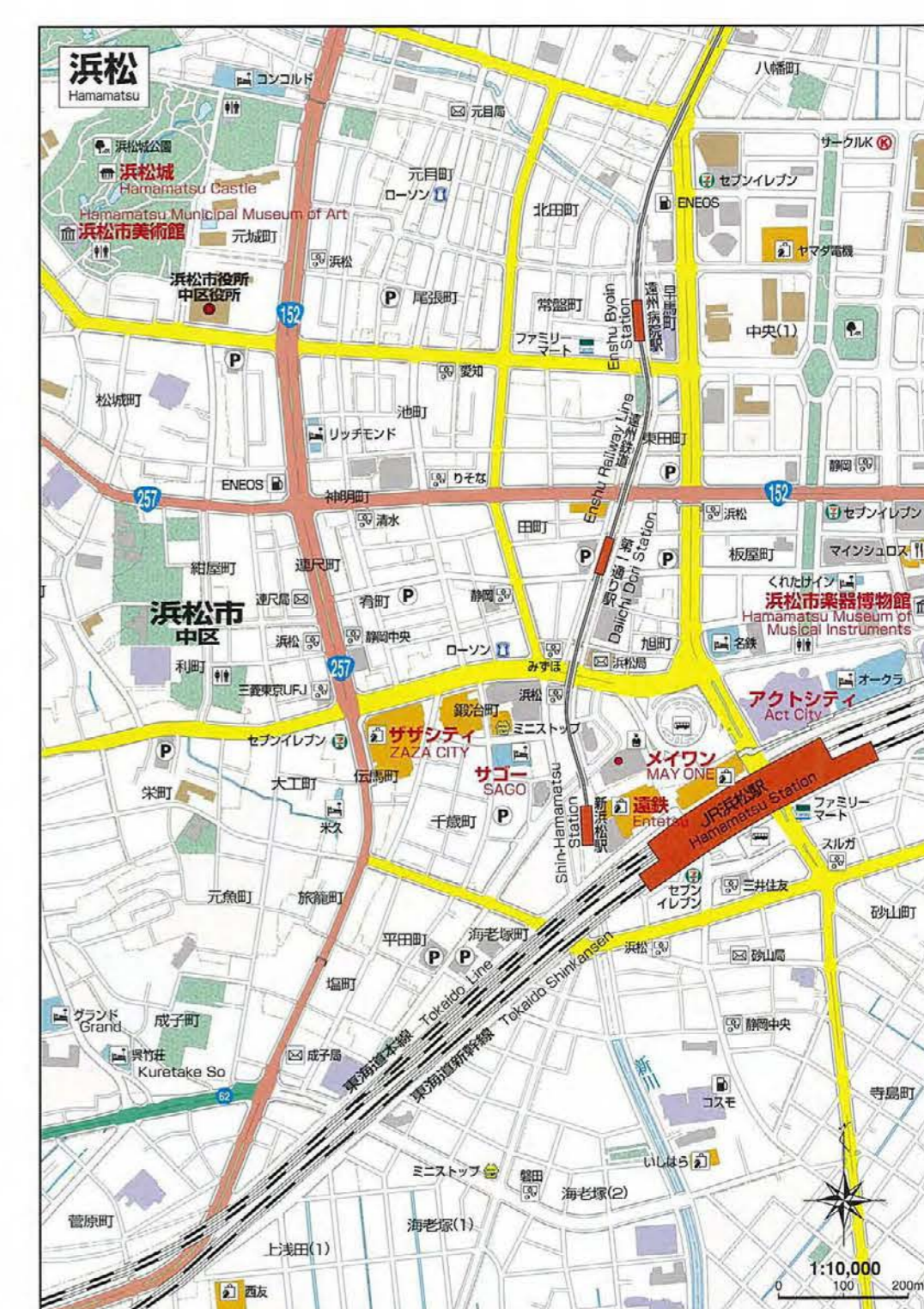
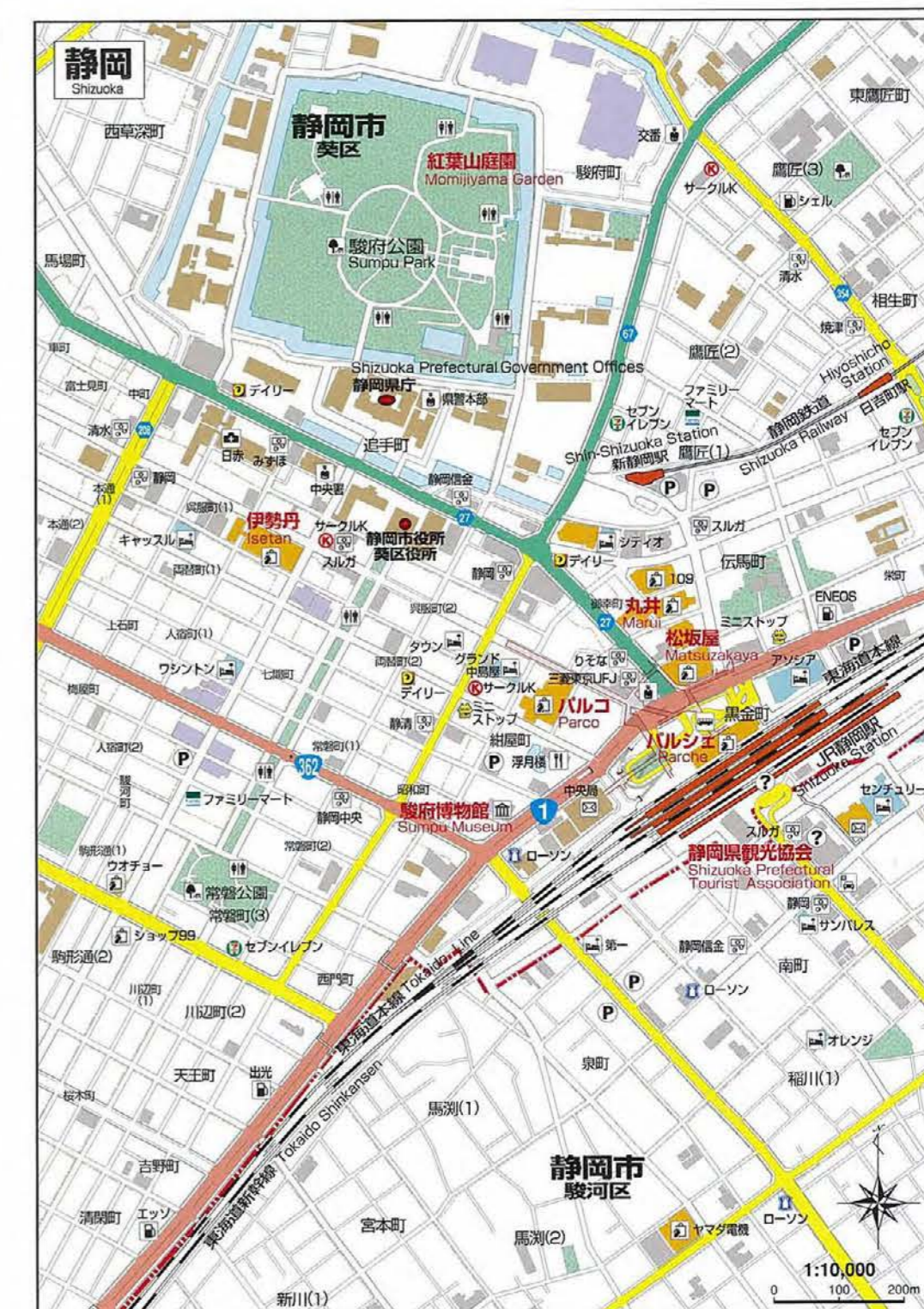
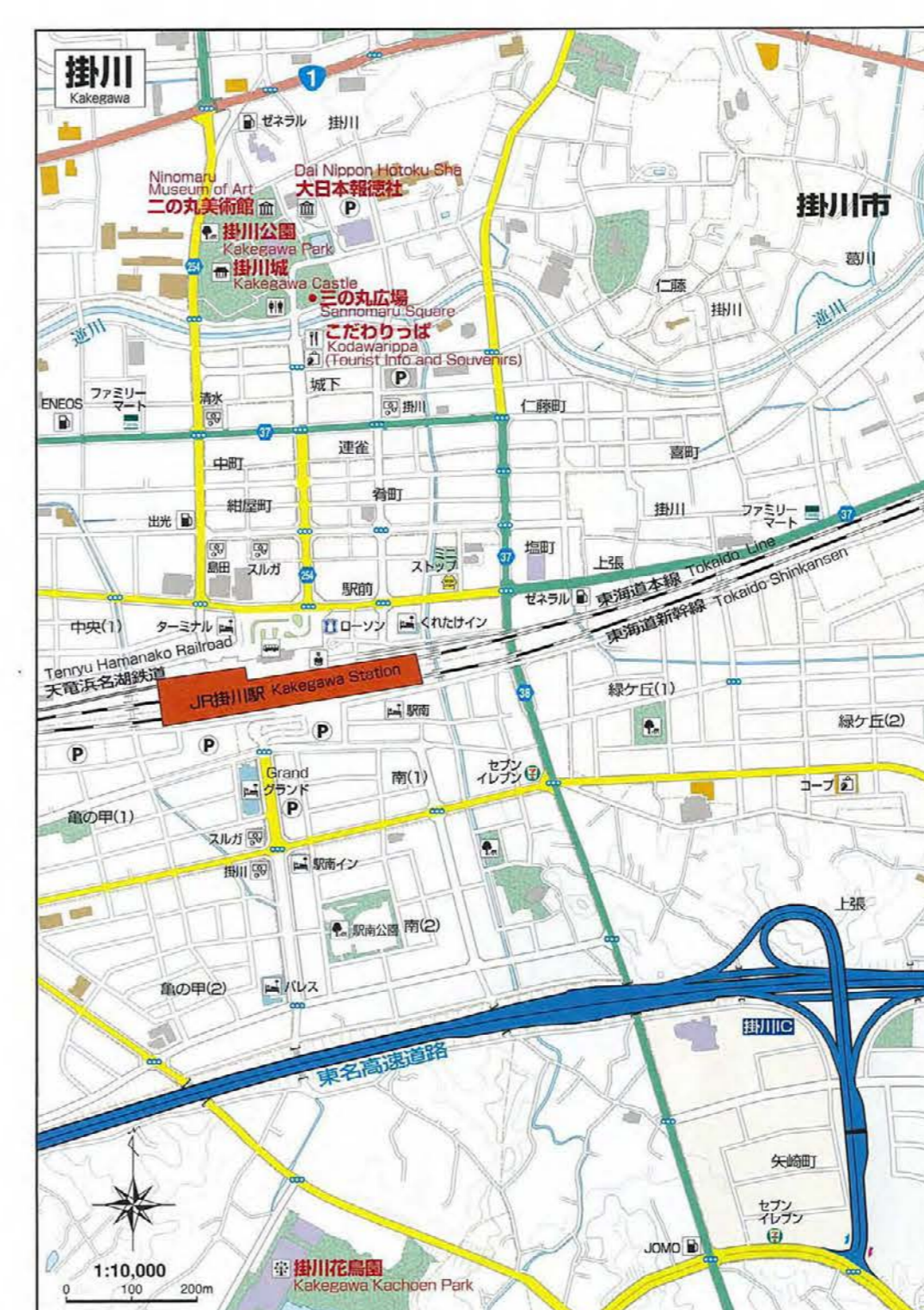
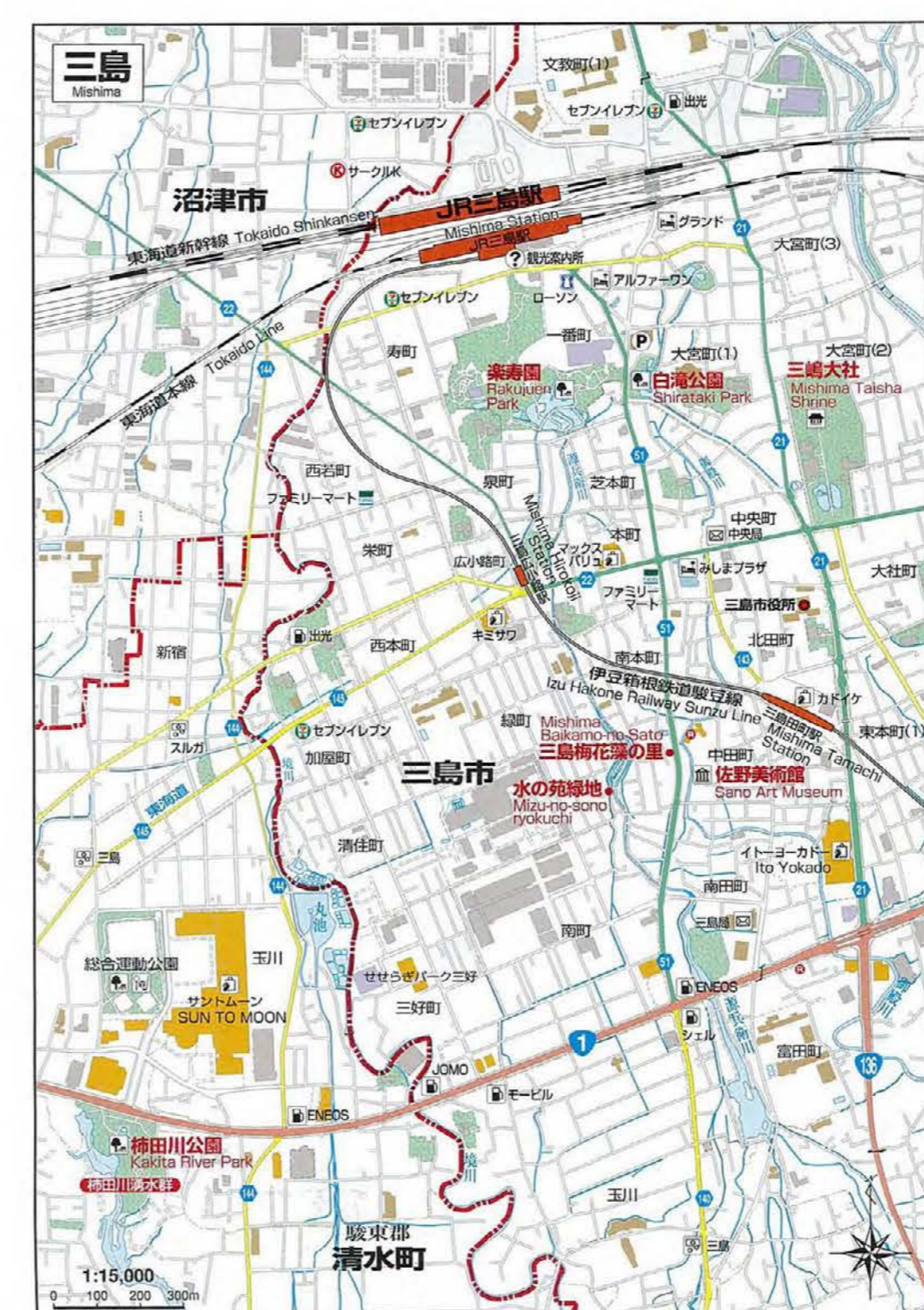
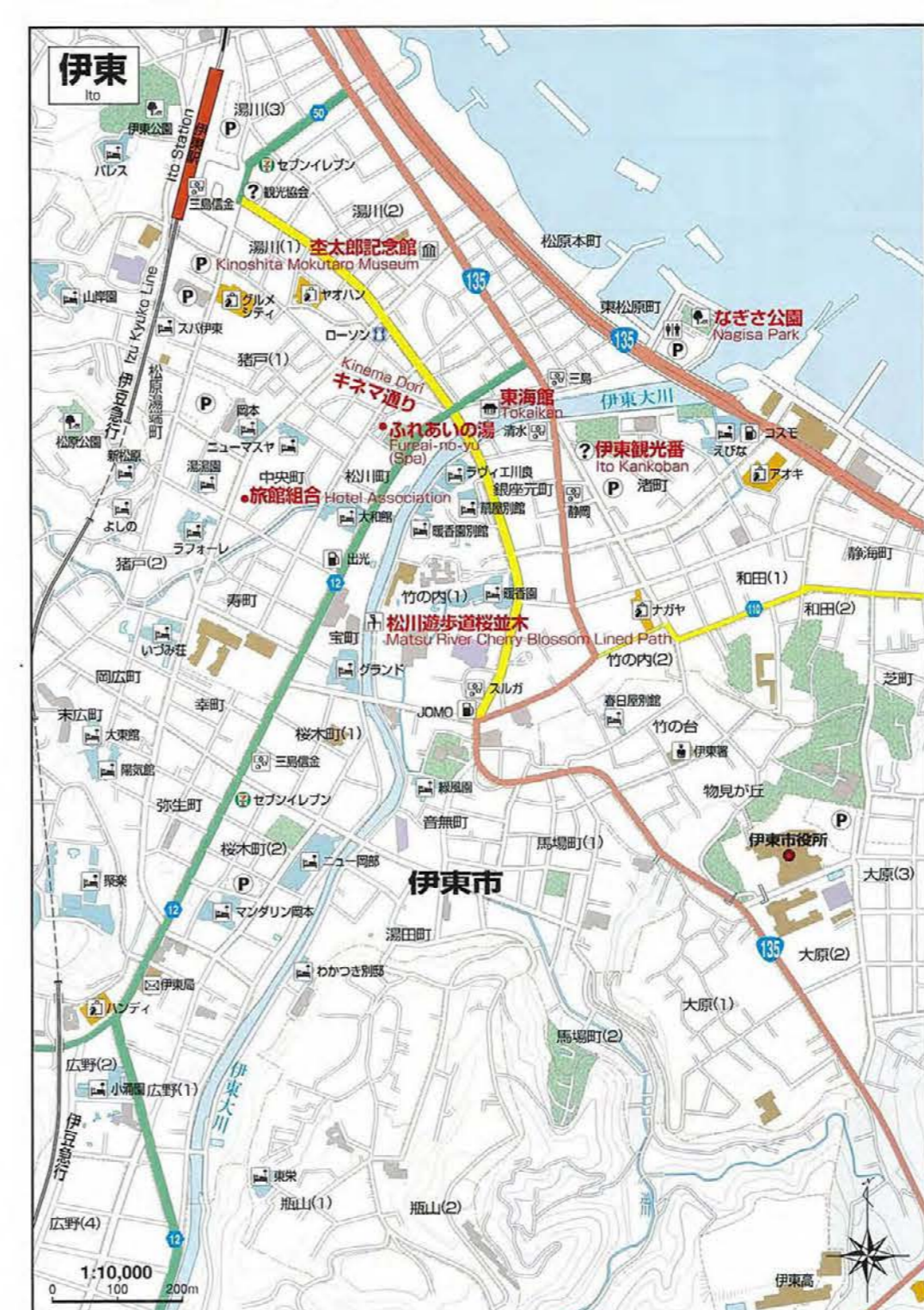
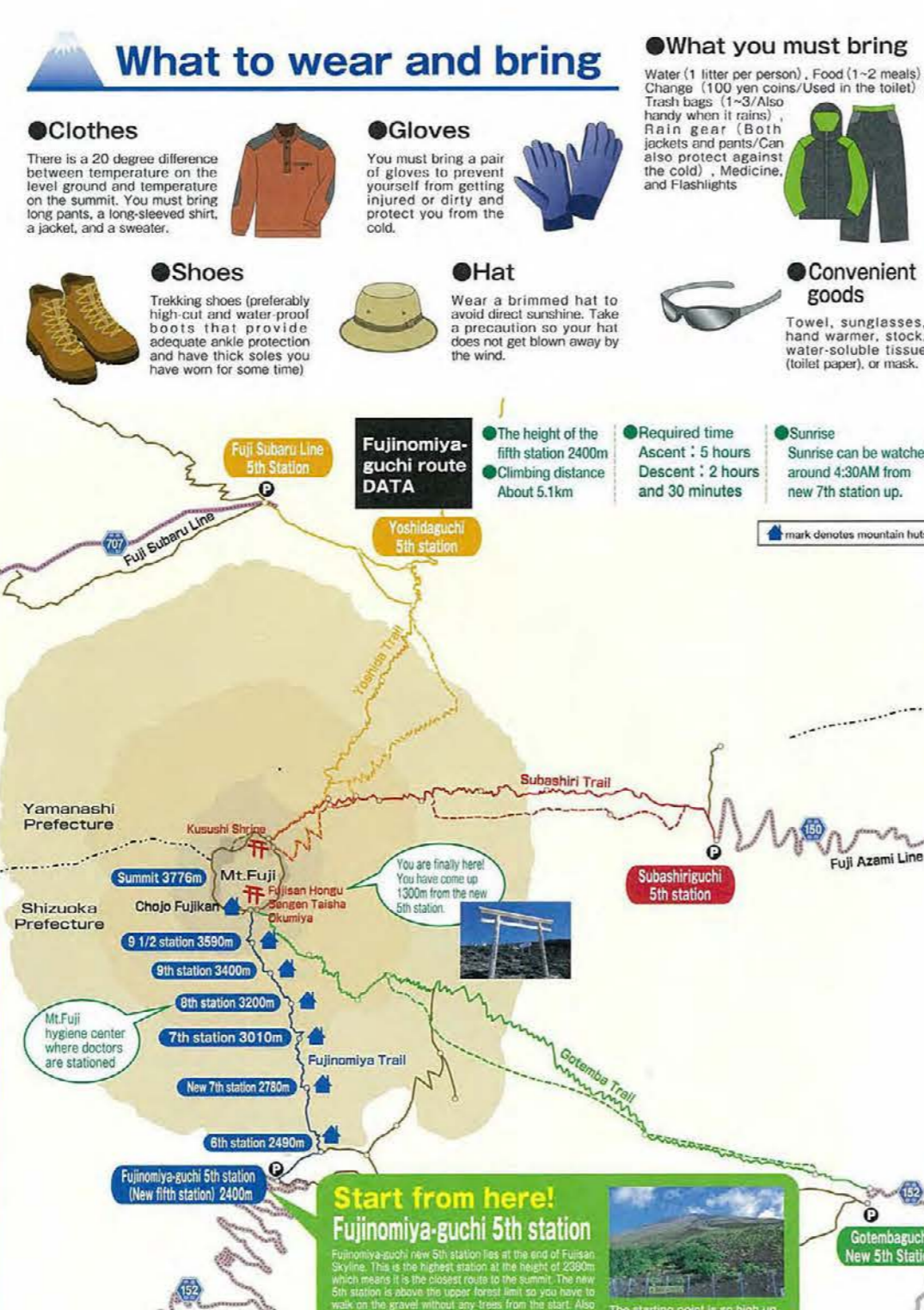
The Mt. Fuji climbing season is from July 1st to August 31st. Shizuoka has the following three routes: Fujinomiya, which is closest to the summit, Gotemba, which has the huge Hotoi Volcano and ash covered paths, and Subashiri, the closest route possible to the summit from the bus terminal.

## Tips and advice for climbing Mt. Fuji

- Adjust at the fifth station for some time before climbing to adjust to the higher altitude and prevent altitude sickness.
- Atmospheric pressure on Mt. Fuji is two thirds of the pressure at ground level. To prevent altitude sickness, do not rush. Walk at your own pace.
- Climb at a pace at that matches your physical strength and physical condition.
- Take a break when tired and take water, salt and sugar regularly.
- Start descending if you feel unwell.
- Designate a rendezvous spot with friends and stay in the designated area to meet your friends.
- The weather constantly changes. Bring rainwear, cold weather gear, and a change of clothes.
- When you feel in danger such as near lightning, take a refuge in the mountain hut nearby.
- When you have competitors, check if the competitors are following you regularly so no one can get lost.
- When you climb the mountain at night, be sure to bring flashlights or headlamps.
- Mountain huts are not open 24 hours a day, be careful not to make a noise outside after 22:00 hours so as not to bother the climbers resting inside the huts.
- Do not kick stones as this might cause falling rocks.
- When you are in trouble, injured or unwell, contact the temporary police station at the fifth station, the hygiene center at the eighth station, or the mountain huts.

- 2 For Shimada (Approx. 25 min to Shimada Station South Exit)**
  - Operation Route: Mt.Fuji Shizuoka Airport → Shimada Station South Exit
- 3 For Kakegawa (Approx. 25 min to Kikugawa Station and approx. 40 min to Kakegawa Station South Exit)**
  - Operation Route: Mt.Fuji Shizuoka Airport → Kikugawa Station → Kakegawa Station South Exit
- 4 For Hamamatsu/Kakegawa (Approx. 30 min to Kakegawa Station, approx. 80 min to Hamamatsu Nishi Interchange, and approx. 120 min to Hamamatsu Station)**
  - Operation Route: Mt.Fuji Shizuoka Airport → Kakegawa Station South Exit → Kakegawa Interchange → Tomi Fukuroi → Iwata Interchange → Tomi Hamamatsu Kita → Hamamatsu Nishi Interchange (Transfer) → Hamamatsu Station

### Central Area

Region full of history and culture  
 Ieyasu Tokugawa, founder of the Tokugawa Shogunate that began the Edo Government, is home to this area. As a region that was depicted in famous woodblock prints, there are a variety of historical attractions. Shizuoka's famous local products of green tea and fresh seafood are plentiful.

- Kunozan Toshogu Shrine**: Ieyasu Tokugawa, who spent 43 years of his life in Shizuoka City, is buried in the shrine. The architectural structures, which were intricately decorated and built with the best technology of the time, are a sight to see. All 11 buildings within the shrine grounds have been designated as National Important Cultural Properties.

- Horai Bridge**: The first bridge over the Oi River, an area that was referred to as the most perilous spot on the road. A professionally set bridge, its length and width with 87m and 27m respectively. This bridge has been registered in the National Natural Heritage List.
