During the Edo Period, princesses loved to travel the road known as the Himekaidō or Princess Highway. The Princess Journey is a reenactment of that ancient tradition. The focus of attention is on the princess being carried on a palanquin, followed by samurai warriors, women of the house, and others, as they travelled through Kiga, and the cherry blossoms of Miyakodagawa sakurazumi.


# Map of Hamamatsu

The map shows Hamamatsu's location in Shizuoka Prefecture, Aichi Prefecture, and Enshu-nada. Key features include:
 

- Transportation:** Tokaido Shinkansen, San-en Nanshin Expressway, Hamamatsu Inland Sea Expressway, and various ICs (Inasa, Mikkabi, Hamamatsu, Iwata, Kakegawa).
- Landmarks:** Lake Hamana, Mt. Fuji, Ashigami Shrine, Takane Castle, Yamazumi Shrine, Myojinkyo, Ryuuu Gongen, Mizube no Komichi, and various temples like Daifuku-ji, Hoko-ji, Ryotan-ji, and Shosan Hori-ji.
- Facilities:** Hamamatsu Science Museum, Hamamatsu Museum of Musical Instruments, Hamamatsu Zoological Gardens, Hamamatsu Flower Park, Air Park, and Hamamatsu Castle.
- Hotspots:** Mikkabi Onsen, Hamanako Onsen, and Bentenjima Onsen.

## Lake Hamana

The shoreline beauty changes with the seasons and is dotted with many famous ancient shrines.

Tokugawa Ieyasu, founder and first shogun of the Tokugawa shogunate, made Hamamatsu Castle his headquarters. Since the reign of Ieyasu, a number of other feudal daimyo who occupied the castle also achieved success (shusse) earning the Castle the name "Shussejo" or Castle of Success.

## Hamamatsu Gyoza

Utsunomiya and Hamamatsu are the two biggest gyoza consumers in Japan. Gyoza served with boiled bean sprouts is a local specialty of many restaurants.
