

This museum is housed in a modern building designed by Kisho Kurokawa, and stands in the middle of Shirakawa Park. The museum's collection of approximately 6.300 works includes those by Modigliani approximately o, oov works includes mose by modiginal and others of the School of Paris period, as well as Mexican Renaissance works, modern art from Japan and abroad, and works by local artists. The park grounds are decorated with sculptures by famous artists, allowing visitors to encounter art as they stroll through the park.


